Every registered teacher of religion in a Catholic school in Queensland requires Accreditation to teach Religion in a Catholic school.

Since all primary school teachers teach religion as part of the curriculum, accreditation to teach religion is particularly important for primary school teachers. The Foundations course meets the study requirements for accreditation to teach religion, gving you wider opportunities at employment in the Catholic sector.



The Foundations course from the Institute of Faith Education has been designed to meet those requirements. Its course design and competency-based assessment process make it a relevant and popular option for teachers or students training to become teachers who seek employment in a Catholic School.



Why Foundations?

The Foundations Course (Diploma of Christian Ministry and Theology 10743NAT) has been developed to provide the required practical and theoretical knowledge of religious education, theology, and spirituality to meet the requirements to teach religion in a Catholic school.

What will you study?

Foundations involves the completion of four units as part of the Diploma of Christian Ministry and Theology:

- 7 Theology and Catholic identity. Explore the context of a Catholic school, hospital or parish. Identify how values, expectations and priorities shape work in a Catholic context. Develop self-awareness as well as strategies for managing health and well-being in the workplace.
- Scripture: The world of the Bible. The Bible is not a simple book; much less a book of quick answers. What role does it play for Christians? Is it divinely inspired and what does that mean? How can we make sense of the Bible and how can we use it appropriately in a classroom or in ministry settings? This unit explores the nature and content of the Bible, some of its important themes and topics and strategies for interpreting and applying the Bible today.
- / Church: Ritual, Liturgy and Sacraments. Explore differences between the Catholic Church and other denominations. Understand what is meant by a 'sacrament' in the Catholic Church and how the sacraments shape spirituality in a Catholic context. How do people connect with deeper meaning through rituals and sacraments?
- Belief, Ethics and Catholic Social Teaching. Ethics is about making good choices. It is also about the kind of person you are, and the fundamental choices you make about who you will be. Explore frameworks for thinking ethically about contemporary issues. Learn more about how the Catholic Church reflects on contemporary social issues. How can an institution like the Catholic Church, long associated with a conservative approach that resists change and looks to the past, have been delivering for so long a progressive message that challenges the prevailing global economic and political order to be more just?





COURSE STRUCTURE

Foundations course design is flexible, and you can complete the four units in this course in any order. You have two years from starting the first unit to complete the course. This means you can complete all units either over one or two years.

Each unit involves structured learning that integrates private study with online or faceto-face workshops. Each unit also embeds a number of competencies which make up the Diploma of Christian Ministry and Theology.

A total of ten competencies need to be achieved to gain the Diploma of Christian Ministry and Theology (10743NAT). Competencies are assessed through projects, presentations, written assessments and learning journals. Workshop attendance is a requirement of this course.

Units are offered over twelve weeks during term time, or in intensive mode over a shorter period. Contact us for a current timetable of scheduled courses.

Upon completion of Foundations, you will be well resourced to teach Religious Education with confidence in a contemporary Catholic context.
