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Principal's foreword

The 2021 Annual Report presents information for reporting requirements and informs the wider community of our school's operations and achievements through the year. The report includes information on the school's profile, curriculum delivery, social climate, school funding, workforce composition and student performance.

Our 2021 Annual School Report provides us with an opportunity to celebrate the achievements of this school year. All Saints Parish School was established in 1989 to provide a high-quality Catholic Education to students of Albany Creek, Eatons Hill and surrounding areas. We have grown to a medium sized school of 610 students. Big enough to provide a comprehensive curriculum, but small enough to know and care for all students.

School progress towards its goals in 2021

Catholic School Perspectives were embedded across the English Curriculum P-6;

Improvement processes were implemented to improve the teaching of Mathematics, including planning, pedagogy and assessment. Professional Development Days, Guest Speakers, visits to other schools and staff goal setting all contributed to the success of this improvement.

Further development occurred in Positive Behaviour for Learning outcomes formalising tier 1 and tier 2 practices. Professional Development Days with Behaviour Support Education Officers from Brisbane Catholic Education accompanied by a PB4L staff team ensure that tier 1 and tier 2 practices are now embedded into our culture. Parent education accompanied this journey.

The parent bodies were reshaped under three pillars – Faith, Learning and Community, Surveys, critical friends and local consultation supported the transition into our Face and Community Engagement Parent Body.

Future outlook

All Saints Primary School's 2022 goals are as follows:

- For all in the community, staff, students and parents to speak confidently around our motto, Walk in Love, which encompasses the Mission and Vision of the school.
- We will create more opportunities for students to engage in social action, relationship building, and caring for creation through a parliamentary model led by our school leaders. Our staff will engage in revisiting our Vision and Mission through the life of our patron St Francis Xavier.
- To build further capacity and consistency in teachers' pedagogical practice in the teaching of Mathematics informed by evidence-based effective practices. Success will be constantly monitored through termly staff goal setting reviews, using our Business Intelligence Tool, student goal setting, Review and Response procedures, and through compliance checks of our

planning documents and teacher timetables. The leadership team also are involved in regular classroom visits to support teachers in their pedagogy.

- To build on the safe environment for all, nurturing all aspects of wellbeing through staff, student and parent voice.
- The formation of vertical staffing groups used for decision making, wellbeing check ins accompanied by role clarifications will support our supportive and safe environment. Student support teams will be put into action accompanied by surveys to parents and parent education through the 2nd Steps Program.

In 2021, All Saints Primary School had a total enrolment of 601 students across 25 classes. The average class size was 26 students. We had 7 First Nations and 16 students who were born overseas. Our students are engaged, and all times aim for their personal best whilst operating within a community.

Curriculum implementation

Curriculum overview

We continue to be guided by the Brisbane Catholic Education Model of Pedagogy. Our school employs a full time Primary Learning Leader and two full time Support Teachers: Inclusive Education along with a full time Guidance Counsellor. Three weeks cycles of planning occur to review learning, respond to data and plan for differentiated learning. All staff engage in levels of teaching response to ensure learning engagement. Data reviews are carried out weekly responding to engagement and attendance.

How information and communication technologies are used to assist learning

All teachers and designated school officers are trained in the Office 365 suite and its incorporation into teaching and learning and management of student data. The school is well resourced with 1:1 device program in Years 4 to 6 and a 1:2 device for Prep to Year 3. Students also have access to a technology lab and a Mac lab, both being well resourced. Staff and students are very competent in their use of Microsoft Teams and Sway. All staff use a form of class blog to connect with parents and carers via the school portal. Our Learning Support Program uses technology to support children's learning needs.

Social climate

Overview

A spirit of collaboration and cooperation is the hallmark of our school climate, it is often described as a family atmosphere. Mechanisms are in place encouraging parent voice. A buddy system exists between older and younger students. New staff engage in an induction program. Staff morale is extremely high, and their wellbeing is supported by the focus on one of our patrons each year. Each class has a parent contact to facilitate important social and pastoral connections. All Saints is committed to the Positive Behaviour for Learning Program and adheres to the Brisbane Catholic Education Behaviour Support Program. This policy and program takes a firm stance against bullying.

- Parent Information Sessions according to the Annual Plan.



Description of how non-attendance is managed by the school

We record student attendance and respond to instances of irregular attendance. We investigate patterns and underlying causes of non-attendance.

Class rolls are marked digitally at 8.50am and at 2.15pm. Texts are sent automatically to parents/caregivers for unexplained absences.

We continue to reinforce with parents the importance of every minute at school through newsletters and announcements on our digital school notice board. Teachers also reinforce with students their commitment to preparing themselves for a school day.
