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Principal's foreword

The 2021 Annual Report presents information for reporting requirements and informs the wider community of our school's operations and achievements through the year. The report includes information on the school's profile, curriculum delivery, social climate, school funding, workforce composition and student performance.

St Joseph's Catholic Primary School is situated in a picturesque setting with views to both the mountains and the city. The school's motto of 'Jesus in each other' provides insight into the importance that is placed on the children understanding the need to be considerate of others and working together to achieve our goals. St Joseph's has excellent facilities with a new classroom building project planned for 2022. What makes St Joseph's such a good school though is the people. The students, staff and parents work collaboratively with the parish community to make St Joseph's a happy and safe place that offers an education that challenges children to be the best they can be.

School progress towards its goals in 2021

Our school goals include:

Goal 1: All teachers will collect, analyse and utilise data to develop teaching responses. Strategies:

- As part of the NGRSF Project we worked with Education Officers to deepen teachers' understanding on how data analysis is informing teaching practice.
- In partnership with the Support Teachers Inclusive Education, we targeted student intervention in the areas of most need.
- More assessment tools were used to specifically target learning and intervention strategies for students to improve literacy growth.
- Home partnerships were developed with some students who had not progressed, to develop strategies that can be followed up at home.
- The teaching staff participated in BCE led in-service to build capacity to analyse data to inform next teaching steps that align with the Australian Curriculum.
 - o In relation to this goal there is greater differentiation of learning for students
 - A growth in student performance across all levels.

Goal 2: We will develop rigorous assessment tasks in Religious Education that provide opportunities for learners to deepen their knowledge, understanding and skills.

Strategies:

- Year level team meetings occur with the Asistant Principal to develop assessment tasks that enable students to show their capabilities in Religion.
- Year level teams then collaboratively developed assessment tasks for each subsequent planning cycle

 In relation to this goal, we see greater differentiation in assessment opportunities, evidence of growth in achievement levels and consistent engagement in daily class prayer.

Future outlook

Our future focus will be:

- to consolidate the learnings from the goals above.
- to continue to focus on the collection and analysis of data to ensure that the understanding of that data can be translated into more effective and differentiated learning for students. Teachers will be involved in professional development will support better and more effective use and understanding of data provided. Specific focus will be on the use of Pat R and Pat M data obtained during the school year.
- to have a greater focus on developing high expectations for students in all areas with a specific
 focus on challenging the performance of already high achieving students. To achieve this,
 teachers will be provided Professional Development opportunities for providing effective
 feedback and peer sharing opportunities to enhance performance. Students will be provided
 with differentiated assessment and learning opportunities to provide evidence of academic
 growth. A focus on improving comprehension skills has been identified as key to improved
 reading performance.
- to ensure plans are in place for future school resourcing, including the master plan for additional school upgrades. A maintenance plan will be completed by mid-2022 and a timeline for future improvements developed from this information.

We have an outstanding group of young people who make up our student body. Most live within this Parish of Bracken Ridge and Bald Hills and have established good relationships both in and out of school. We support children from a variety of cultures and offer them quality education within a safe and happy environment. We cater for students with diverse needs including those with ascertained needs and those for whom English is a second language. Our older students are our school leaders and support the staff in different aspects of school life. Our Buddy program sees students from different year levels interacting closely across the school. The good behaviour and care of each other shown by our students is a feature of St Joseph's children. Upon graduation, students attend a variety of Catholic and State secondary colleges, primarily St John Fisher College for the female students and St Patrick's College for the male students. A new Catholic coeducational secondary college, Holy Spirit College, Fitzgibbon opened in 2022. St Joseph's students are already a major feeder to this college.

Curriculum implementation

Curriculum overview

St Joseph's offers a wide variety of subjects. The basic core skills are covered in English, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Sciences, and Science. Religious Education is provided to all students as an integral part of our curriculum and ethos of our school community. The curriculum is diverse to provide a range of learning opportunities and cater for the individual style of learning that each child possesses.

We proudly offer all students the opportunity to participate and excel in all subjects, in our instrumental music and choir programs, school musicals and concerts, sport at school, district and regional level. Our highly trained teachers, support staff, teacher aides, office staff, cleaners and grounds staff comprise a team of dedicated people working together in the best interests of all students.

Our specialised staff offer diversity in programs catering for difference in learners' needs in learning difficulty, extension and enrichment. Other subjects taught at St Joseph's include Art, Drama, Library, Music, Health & Physical Education (H.P.E) and L.O.T.E (Language other than English) - Japanese. All students from Prep to Year 6 participate in L.O.T.E. classes.

In addition, children from Years 3 to 6 who qualify are able to take part in an Instrumental Music Program which is held in school time. This includes Woodwind, Brass and Percussion and a Beginner's Band as well as an Advanced Band. Students from Year 1 are able to access our School's Strings Program, and eventually join our School Orchestra. Children may also join a choir in any Year level or have private voice lessons. Students who wish to learn the piano and guitar are also provided that opportunity.

How information and communication technologies are used to assist learning

Information Communication and Learning Technology is used broadly across the school to support student learning. All Year levels have access to iPads and laptops with students in Years 3 to 6 part of a 1:1 iPad program. Each classroom is supported by interactive whiteboards and Redcat sound systems. Technology is a Cross-Curriculum priority taught at St Joseph's.

Social climate

Overview

There is a great deal of collaboration in our school to develop the sense of community that exists here. Our school motto of 'Jesus in each other' is evident through the interactions of staff, students and parents. St Joseph's caters for children from many and varied backgrounds, ability levels and cultures. All children are treated equally and given equal opportunity in their educational and extra-curricular activities. Ethnic backgrounds and religion are always taken into account when planning special occasions that may involve particular religious celebrations. St Joseph's has clear guidelines for responding to any incidents of bullying or general misbehaviour. We draw our enrolment predominantly from the suburbs of Bracken Ridge and Bald Hills, but children also travel distances to attend our school, attracted by our academic reputation and quality education. Over the past year our school ran a number of programs to support our students and parents. Our P&F engage various presenters to educate parents on a variety of topics.

 will give an overview of the curriculum for the year, the organisation of the class is discussed,
 procedures explained, and parents are informed of excursions etc. that they can expect their
 child to be involved in during the year.
- St Joseph's School has an active Parents and Friends Association which always welcomes new
 members. Through our P&F we raise much needed funds for equipment, resources and
 computers and major projects like our Colour Run are significant fundraisers. School discos,
 new family welcome, Mother's and Father's Day breakfasts, Carols evening, Trivia Night,
 Mother/Son and Father/Daughter events are also on the annual calendar. Some of these were
 cancelled in 2021 due to Covid-19 restrictions but plans are in place for their continuation in
 2022
- Our School Board supports policy development at St Joseph's
- Our school Tuckshop is open 4 days a week and is run by a Convenor, supported by parents and friends.
- Our school has a great relationship with the Parish and supports a number of the community care initiatives.



Description of how non-attendance is managed by the school

Student attendance is recorded twice daily. This occurs prior to 9am and again at midday. Late attendance and early departures are also recorded. Students who arrive after 8:30am must present at the school office for their late attendance to be electronically recorded by office staff. Absences are recorded and parents contacted via SMS if the school is not notified of non-attendance. Attendance levels of all students is monitored and regular absenteeism is followed up with the parents by the Principal where the absenteeism is unexplained.

School attendance is constantly reinforced through the school newsletters, assemblies and posters. The school has a goal of 90% of students attending 90% of the time. This percentage is monitored throughout the year.
