### Principal's foreword

Jubilee Primary School is one of Brisbane Catholic Education's three Ecumenical Schools. Jubilee is founded on a partnership of students, parents, staff, pastors and parishioners at a local level within the broader mission of the four associated churches - : St Mary's Catholic Community, Coomera; Southland International - Apostolic Australia Church; Gold Coast North Anglican Church; Living Rivers Uniting Church and New Life Uniting Church. Jubilee is a living vision of local churches.

Our school community works together – united in our belief in Jesus Christ and His values and supporting each other in many different and important ways. It is this partnership that develops a feeling of family and also pride in our school.

Our school offers children the opportunity to participate in a vast array of spiritual, educational, cultural and sporting activities. We seek to provide opportunities for students to be the best that they can be in whichever field that may be. While we have a significant focus currently on extending our already improving literacy achievements for students, our goal is the development of well rounded students who feel that they can make a difference in their world. We seek to develop not just the academic strengths of students but all aspects in order to help students be all that they can be as people.

## Characteristics of the student body

Pacific Pines is a socio-economically area suffering large burdens of financial stress with an unemployment rate of 8.1% compared to 7.4% for the Gold Coast area. There are a large number of rental properties in Pacific Pines. The most predominant occupation in the area leans towards persons being employed as Technicians and Trade Workers (17.4% compared to 15.4% which is the average for South East QLD); compared to a smaller percentage of persons employed as Professionals (14.8% compared to 17.4%) \* Taken from 2011 Census data.

Jubilee Primary School was established in 2001 as Brisbane Catholic Education's first Ecumenical School. There are four Christian Traditions involved with Jubilee Primary School:

- Catholic (St Mary's Catholic Parish, Upper Coomera)
- Anglican (Gold Coast North Anglican Church)
- Apostolic (Southland Christian Centre, Pacific Pines)
- Uniting (Living Rivers Uniting, Nerang, Pimpama & Coomera) and New Life Uniting (Pacific Pines)

Jubilee's catchment areas are as follows; Pacific Pines, Oxenford, Helensvale, Coomera, Upper Coomera, Hope Island, Maudsland, Gaven, Guanaba, Wongawallan and Paradise Point.

## Social climate

Jubilee Primary School is a supportive community which fosters positive and healthy interactions between all students, staff, parents and wider community.

As a Christ-centered community we:

- promote the achievement of excellence within a caring Christian faith traditions (Unity);

Jubilee Primary School is blessed to have a fulltime teacher seconded to Campus Ministry.

## Curriculum - our distinctive offerings

Jubilee Primary School offers a wide variety of subject areas which include: English, Mathematics, Science, HASS, Health and Physical Education, Technology, LOTE and The Arts. Religious Education is provided to all students as part of our curriculum, thus promoting our Ecumenical ethos.

Inclusive Support practices by Learning Enhancement Team; Recognition of different Christian formats of worshiping within the Religious Life of Jubilee Primary School; Providing explicit learning and teaching of Religious Education in an Ecumenical context; Eisteddfod participation; Music (P-6); Health and Physical Education (P-6); Indonesian (1-6); Drama - Prep; Camps (5 - Lake Ainsworth & 6 - Canberra/Sydney); Interschool Sport (Years 4-6); Sporting Competitions: District, Catholic Schools' Interschool Winter; Swimming Instruction (Prep-6); End of Year Christmas Concert; Celebration of Learning: Book Week; 100th day of School

## SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENTS

### **Achievements against 2017 annual plan**

Our biggest goal in 2017 has been the further development and growth of students general literacy results, especially in the area of reading. Our goal was that 85% of students in Years Prep to Two would be at the aspirational targets as set by Brisbane Catholic Education. Previously Jubilee had not achieved these marks. In Year Two we had almost 81% of students achieve this mark which was an increase from 49% in Year 2 in 2016. In Year One we had 87% reach the target, and increase from 64%, and 70% of Prep students. This data points that we have begun making progress and towards our overall goal of better literacy achievement for students.

### **Future outlook**

In 2018 we will continue to maintain focus on Literacy levels for students and also have an emerging focus on Numeracy.

Given our growth in 2017, the goal for 2018 will be beyond last years literacy goal. We will continue to ensure these essentials are learnt to a high standard and will further incorporate higher levels of writing ability as a strong focus in 2018.
